

Sanmar to host cricket team from Kashmir as part of peace initiative

The team, on a national integration cum sports tour for the youth of Kashmir from Srinagar to Chennai, is 'Srinagar Shah Jahans'—runner-up in the recently concluded Kashmir Premier League (KPL), one of the several positive steps of integration announced by Lt Gen Syed Ata Hasnain, soon after taking over in December 2010 as general of the Srinagar-based 15 Corps, which controls all military operations in the Valley.

Gen Hasnain declared 2011 to be the 'Year of the Kashmiri Awam', when the army would devote itself to the welfare of the people and be more humane.

Among several measures to win the confidence of Kashmiri youth, the army held 300 matches between 193 teams of the first Kashmir Premier League T20 tournament last summer.
